Program

Restorative Justice by Richard Moore, founding member and facilitator for Prescott Area Restorative Initiatives (PARI). Mr. Moore gave an overview of Restorative Discipline practices including the following synopsis of Restorative Questions.

Author's view: What happened in this event?

What were you thinking at the time? What have you thought about since?

Who has been affected by what you have done?

Persons Impacted: What was your first reaction to this event?

How has this incident harmed you? What has been the hardest thing for you?

Any lingering questions for you about the event?

All Participants: What needs to happen now to make things right?

The restorative circle process is three fold: mutual comprehension, self-responsibility, and agreed actions.

Helen Colson-Carr reported that her oldest son was married a year ago and has a 9 month old baby. Well, his wife just found out she is pregnant again!

Dorothy Eichbaum's grandson in the Marines is coming back from Kuwait. He will dock in Pearl Harbor November 20 and be home for Thanksgiving.

Sherry Baca shared that her 11 month old granddaughter had surgery at Phoenix Children's Hospital on Oct. 21 with 5 doctors. The surgeon removed the nasal feeding tube and inserted a gastric tube in the baby's side. Tests and biopsies were done by the ENT, the Pulmonologist, the GI, and the Audiologist. The good news was that the tests showed everything was normal including the baby's hearing so there is no structural reason why she cannot swallow. This means it is probably developmental and will be treated with feeding therapy and electronic throat stimulation. They are hoping that in 2-3 years the baby will be able to swallow on her own and not only be able to take liquid nourishment through the tube in her side.
