We did discover, though, that some very unique and exciting effects can be achieved with just a brush stroke. Even though there were varied levels of expertise in the room, all were very happy with the instruction and the experience.

We concluded the session with lunch in a nearby restaurant, the Grand Canyon Cafe, and a visit to the gallery which Bonnie owns with three other artists. Along with experiencing such a delightful time, it was also so nice to meet and spend time with members of the TAU chapter.


This year is made more difficult by the fact that there will not be a Miller Valley School next year, so everything must be sorted and moved to other buildings.

We did LOTS of cutting! Clockwise from top: Bonnie Waterer, Marilyn Jenkins, Sherry Baca, and Linda Cramer






