SIX ETA CHAPTER MEMBERS FEATURED IN ARIZONA SAHUARO JULY NEWSLETTER

At the 2015 Omicron State Convention, three 50- year members were honored. One was **Becky Shields** of Eta Chapter. Becky is a Phoenix native. Her teaching career spread from San Bernardino, California to Glendale, and then to Prescott where she taught kindergarten until her retirement. Shields is a pillar of the American Lutheran Church where she has devoted her tie and energy. She serves the "least of these" promoting the first purpose of our Society.

Seven individuals were recognized for their contributions to the community or to the field of education at the Omicron State Conference luncheon on April 25, 2015. Each of these professional women were honored with a special certificate and were featured in a PowerPoint presentation. **Marilyn Jenkins** has volunteered with Yavapai County Tech Prep Consortium, American Lutheran Church and with community projects such as Dress a Child, Prescott Community Cupboard Food Drive, Habitat for Humanity, and the Prescott Zoo.

<u>Linda Spellman's</u> article entitled "The Truth about Common Core Standards" was recently published in the Verde Valley Independent.

<u>Sherry Alimi</u> recently traveled to Guatemala and was able to contact two of our DKG sisters, Carmen Beatriz de Majia, State Organization President and Claudia Estrada who took her on a tour of their school.

Sherry Baca recently coordinated a Yavapai County Mathematics and Science Day entitled "Soaring to New Heights With Math and Sincere" Baca is one of only 20 educators in the nation to have secured a \$1000 grant to assist with this event. From morning until afternoon, students from all across the country were able to test their brains individually and in teams on practical math and science applications.

FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT AND DUTES UPDATE

SPOTLIGHT ON NEW TRANSFER MEMBER: MARTY LEWIS



Marty Lewis graduated from NAU in 1967 with a degree in Elementary Education and then received her Masters in Special education from the University of San Diego. She taught for 36 years and retired in 2004. Marty taught in four different counties in California: Los Angeles, Riverside, San Diego and Orange. She also taught in Massachusetts, Florida, Phoenix, and the Virgin Islands. Part of the reason she has such an extensive number of places where she taught was due to her husband, Eric, being a Marine Corps Officer so they were transferred to new locations. However, after teaching elementary and special ed for several years, Marty moved into being a middle school counselor. In California they started phasing out these counselors so she had to move to find other counseling positions. Other times she moved because she didn't want to stay in a district with year round school calendars.

One of her favorite positions was teaching special ed for grades 6-9 in the Virgin Islands. She and Eric just decided to sell everything in California and move to the Virgin Islands. They even built a house there which was an adventure. They had to import all the construction supplies to build their home and lived there 5 years. She relates that the school had a staff of 35 of which only 12 were non West Indian teachers. She loved teaching there and still keeps in touch with many of her students who are in their thirties now. In fact, she is planning to go back next year to visit some of them.

After leaving the Virgin Islands, she returned to her home town of Whittier, California to finish her teaching career. This was her hometown so she ended up teaching in the same school she had attended: Dexter Middle School.

Marty has been living in Prescott for the past five years and for four of those years she has been going to school at Yavapai College. She recently finished her AA degree in Social and Human Services and completed an internship with the VA Hospital in mental health. Her internship was at Oasis - a psycho social rehabilitative recovery center at the VA.

Marty and her husband have one son who served as a doctor in the navy but is now retired. They also have two dogs. She belongs to two book clubs, is a member of AAUW, and likes to garden. She plans to continue to volunteer at the Oasis center at the VA Hospital once a week. Welcome, Marty!
