

<u>**CAROL STIMPLE</u>** was asked to share her recipe from the November meeting. Here it is:</u>

EGGS LA STRADA Recipe from Carol Stimple

In a buttered oblong casserole dish (9×13) place 6 - 8 slices of bread covered with Old English cheese spread. Cut off crusts.

Fry 1 ¹/₂ lb. ground sausage and drain well.

Break up sausage and spread over bread & cheese layer.

Blend the following and pour over sausage: 6 eggs, $\frac{1}{4}$ tsp. mustard, 1 tsp. salt, $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. Worcestershire sauce, 2 c. half-and-half. Sprinkle with paprika, cover with foil and refrigerate overnight (a must!).

Bake uncovered in 350° oven for 45 min. or until brown & puffy.
